## Pot Luck Dinner at September 18th Meeting





## Presentation on Sponsorships at September Meeting

Allison and Sue will explain how to sell sponsorships for the club in order to help with expenses for our club projects throughout the year. For those of you out there contacting businesses, remember that there is only one \$1,000 "Captain" (exclusive/sole presenting sponsor for all 4 projects and programs). There are four "Fleet" sponsorships at \$500 available which includes all 4 projects/programs. And we can sell unlimited number of "Lifejackets" sponsorships for \$250 where they specify one project they would like to sponsor. **IMPORTANT:** If you have a business wanting to buy a Captain or Fleet sponsorship, you must call Kim (310-1782) immediately to see if they have been sold already or not. Kim will notify everyone by email when something sells. Remember it is first come basis on Captain and Fleet sponsorships. Info and forms were attached to last month's newsletter or Sue will have more at the September meeting. We hope that by selling sponsorships, we can reduce the number of fundraisers this year to just the Fashion Show and Pecan Sales and still have enough money to operate the club, offer our Anchor Scholarship, and continue our projects in the community.

## 2012-13 Pecan Sales

I have prices for both pecans and almonds now, although the pecan price may change a little - will know by middle of September. We will need to decide what kinds of nuts we want to sell. They offer a party mix, English walnuts, whole almonds and pistachio's, as well as our regular half and piece pecans, sliced almonds, black walnuts and cashews. Here is the price list. This is what we pay.

All are 16 oz (1 pound) bags:

### H. M. Thames Pecan Co.

Whole Almonds - \$4.25  
Sliced Almonds - \$4.30  
English Walnuts - \$6.25  
Black Walnuts - \$7.95  
Gourmet Meats - Party Mix - \$6.10  
Cashews - \$7.25  
Pistachio's - \$5.99

### Schermer Pecans

Pecan halves - \$8.69  
Pecan pieces - \$8.54



Charging \$10.00 per bag, you can see we make less money on the pecans than any other. Of course, that's what most of our buyers want. But we may consider trying some new kinds to sell. We will have to order a minimum of 1 case of each type of nut. We can discuss at the Sept. meeting. Start spreading the word, the nut sales are coming. We want to try to do mostly pre-orders so we are not stuck with so many nuts this year. I still have 4 cases of chocolate covered pecans in my freezer. We are selling for \$5.00 if anyone is interested, call me and I can bring them to the meeting.

## Pilots at "Cool Down in Downtown"


